TRAILS OF RINGWOOD STATE PARK

There are 18 official trails within the park, totaling nearly 40 miles. Many trails begin near Ringwood Manor, Skylands Manor, or Shepherd Lake, and extend into the park. Each area has short trails that allow for exploration of these attractions, and longer trails that explore the surrounding area. Trails are well marked with colored blazes.

Cannonball Trail

Red • 0.6 miles (in Ringwood) • Multi-use Moderate • Connects to Ramapo Mountain State Forest **Trailhead** Shore Trail on south side of Bear Swamp Lake. **Cannonball Trail** travels south from Bear Swamp Lake and continues into Ramapo Mountain State Forest.

Cooper Union Trail Yellow • 4.7 miles • Multi-use

Moderate • Leads to scenic view of Wanaque Reservoir Trailhead Sloatsburg Road on north side of the park. Cooper Union Trail is a lollipop loop trail that begins approximately 0.5 miles north of Ringwood Manor on Sloatsburg Road. The trail heads south through forested hillsides. Near its southern end, the trail diverges to the left and right to make a loop. At the end of the loop, there is a scenic view of Wanaque Reservoir.

Crossover Trail

White • 7 miles • Multi-use Moderate • Trail across park Trailhead Parking area near Carriage Barn. Crossover Trail heads southeast across the park and ends at Cannonball Trail. Along the way, the trail passes by Skylands Manor and provides access to many other trails within the park. A short reroute of Crossover Trail north of Skylands Manor is under construction.

Cupsaw Brook Trail

Light blue • 1.4 miles • Multi-use Moderate • Rocky trail follows creek drainage Trailhead Cooper Union Trail. Cupsaw Brook Trail follows a small drainage downhill towards Cupsaw Lake. The trail heads east along the hillside on single-track and then descends into a ravine. As the trail continues, it follows the creek drainage and joins Ringwood-Ramapo Trail for a short distance. Cupsaw Brook Trail ends when it meets Cooper Union Trail again.

Five Ponds Trail

Pink • 4.8 miles • Multi-use Easy to Moderate • Long loop trail through Skylands area Trailhead Skylands Parking Lot C. Five Ponds Trail follows mostly woods roads on a circuit of five of the Skylands area's ponds - Gatun, Brushwood, Weyble, Glasmere and Swan Pond.

Halifax Trail

Green • 0.4 miles (in Ringwood) • Hiking Moderate • East-west trail across park **Trailhead** Five Ponds Trail east of Glasmere Ponds. **Halifax Trail** is a hiking-only trail that crosses Ringwood in an east-west direction. The trail begins on single-track and ascends switchbacks to gain a ridgeline. As it continues east, Halifax Trail crosses numerous other trails and leads into Ramapo Valley County Reservation.

Hasenclever Iron Trail

Yellow • 1.6 miles (in Ringwood) • Multi-use Easy • Cross country woods road explores history of iron works

Trailhead Ringwood Manor. Hasenclever Iron Trail follows an old woods road that connected the ironworking operations at Long Pond Ironworks State Park and Ringwood State Park. There are interpretive signs and waypoints along the trail that describe the history of iron work in the area.

Hewitt Connector Trail

White • 1 mile • Multi-use Easy • Short loop trail

Trailhead Ringwood Manor parking lot past playground area. **Hewitt Connector Trail** links the parking lot with the north end of Manor Trail. The trail follows single-track and then widens to doubletrack as it meets with Manor Trail.

TRAIL SENSE AND SAFETY

Trail Markings: Official trails are marked by colored blazes on posts and trees. For your safety and habitat protection, please stay on the trails and do not alter trail markings or create new trails.

Preparations: Consider bringing water, snacks, sunscreen, insect repellent, and a hat. Dress for the weather. Tell someone where you plan to go and when you expect to return.

Hunting: Sections are open to hunting. Bright orange clothing is recommended during hunting season.

Pets: Pets must always be on a leash no longer than six feet in length and under the control of the owner at all times. Please clean up after your pets.

Keep It Clean and Green: Bring a bag or two and carry your trash out with you. Trash cans are not provided. Don't forget to recycle!

Bikers: Follow the IMBA "Rules of the Trail" guidelines for trail etiquette and yield appropriately. Helmets are required by law for children under 17 and

Hoeferlin Memorial Trail

Yellow • 2.4 miles (in Ringwood) • Multi-use Moderate • Connects to Ramapo Mountain State Forest **Trailhead** Numerous access points throughout the park. **Hoeferlin Memorial Trail** is a long trail connecting to Ramapo Mountain State Forest. The trail ascends from Bear Swamp Lake, reaches a ridgeline and turns south. Hoeferlin Memorial Trail continues south along a primary ridgeline between the Wanaque Reservoir (to the west) and Ramapo River (to the east).

Manor Trail

Blue • 2.8 miles • Multi-use Easy • Short loop trail above Ringwood Manor Trailhead Ringwood Manor. Manor Trail follows a mix of gravel road and single-track path past Sally's Pond and a colonial-era cemetery then loops through the forested hillside above Ringwood Manor.

Mountain Bike Trail

Brown & silver • 4.7 miles (in Ringwood) • Multi-use Moderate • Loop trail on forest roads across varied terrain **Trailhead** Ringwood - Ramapo Trail. **Mountain Bike Trail** is a long loop trail on a network of woods roads through the hilly landscape of Ramapo Mountain. The trail passes many small ponds as it makes its loop to return to Shepherd Lake.

Pierson Ridge Trail

Blue • 1 mile • Multi-use Easy • Scenic forest road along ridgeline Trailhead Halifax Trail (north end) or Ringwood – Ramapo Trail (south end). Pierson Ridge Trail follows a wide and flat woods road along a ridgeline until it intersects with Crossover Trail.

Ringwood - Ramapo Trail

Red • 5.1 miles (in Ringwood) • Multi-use Moderate • Long trail to Ramapo Mountain State Forest **Trailhead** Parking area near Ringwood Carriage Barn. **Ringwood-Ramapo Trail** leads from the northern section of Ringwood State Park towards the east, then south into Ramapo Mountain State Forest. The trail follows a mix of single-track path and forest roads.

Rocky Mountain Connector

Red & silver • 0.65 miles (in Ringwood) • Multi-use Easy • Access to Bear Swamp Lake Trailhead Shore Trail. Rocky Mountain Connector connects Shore Trail along the east side of Bear Swamp Lake to Ramapo Valley County Reservation.

Shepherd Lake Trail

Orange • 1.2 miles • Multi-use Easy • Loop on hillsides south of lake **Trailhead** Ringwood-Ramapo Trail on south side of Shepherd Lake. **Shepherd Lake Trail** follows a wide gravel road along the lake edge, then turns uphill into the forest and returns along a woods road higher up on the hillside.

Shore Trail

Blue • 1.8 miles • Multi-use Easy • Loop around Bear Swamp Lake **Trailhead** Various points from trails near Bear Swamp Lake. **Shore Trail** follows along the edge of Bear Swamp Lake. Three trails provide access to Shore Trail: Hoeferlin (from north side), Cannonball (from south) and Rocky Mountain Connector (from east). The trail makes a complete loop around the lake.

Skylands Trail

Blue • 0.8 miles • Multi-use Moderate • Short trail along hillside Trailhead Mountain Bike Trail (north end) or Ringwood-Ramapo Trail (south end). Skylands Trail is a short trail that runs north-south along the broad ridgeline of Mount Defiance. The trail is mostly single-track as it winds among rock outcroppings scattered along the hillside.

State Line Trail

Orange • 0.6 miles • Multi-use Moderate • Short trail leads into New York **Trailhead** Ringwood-Ramapo Trail. **State Line Trail** heads north along Sloatsburg Road. At the north end of the park the trail intersects with Cooper Union Trail and crosses into New York state.
